### New Wage Gap Numbers Aren't So New

In Sept. 2013 the U.S. Census Bureau released the 2012 gender wage gap numbers. And guess what. The wage gap still stands at 23 cents. That means a woman working full time, year-round still typically takes home 77 cents for every dollar a man takes home. The gap is even worse for women of color.

The Simple Truth about the Gender Pay Gap is a commonsense guide that provides key facts about the gender pay gap in the United States. Topics covered in the report include: the definition of the pay gap and its history; the pay gap in each state; the pay gap by age, race/ethnicity, and education; guidance for women facing workplace discrimination; and resources for fair pay advocates. Median earnings for men in Missouri were \$42,974 compared to women's median earnings of \$32,868 an earnings ratio of just 76 percent.

Please note that the pay gap figures above are from 2012, the most recently available data. Also note that the above congressional districts represent the 113th Congress.


### **NEW MEMBER SPOTLIGHT:**
