Chelsea Clinton Inspires Sold-Out Crowd at Starr Hall of Fame Launch

Women in Kansas City have a new resource for leadership inspiration – and one of the world's best-known young women came to town to promote the value of such resources. The Starr Women's Hall of Fame launched with great fanfare at a luncheon in February on the UMKC campus. The young woman celebrating its creation was Chelsea Clinton, vice chair of the Clinton Foundation and featured speaker at the event. The new Hall will recognize women from the Metropolitan Kansas City area and preserve the legacy of their accomplishments. In her remarks, Clinton described how members of her generation – and future generations – will benefit. "It's very hard to imagine what you can't see. That's why it is crucial that institutions like this exist," Clinton said. "This will help UMKC students, and other young people, to see what is possible; to shape their dreams and fire their imaginations."

and any requested increase in budget. At the conclusion of each event the committee chair will provide a final report on all expenses.

With the approval of the finance committee and the board, this fund could also support other special branch projects of similar outreach to the community which support the AAUW mission.

Since our bylaws require that any use of Cumulative Reserve funds be approved by a vote of branch membership we are notifying the membership in the April newsletter that we will be presenting this for a vote at the May 8 membership meeting. All members are encouraged to attend in order to vote on this proposal. We believe the use of our cumulative reserve for these events is a good use of those funds.

The following amendment to the AAUW-KC Bylaws will also be voted on:

Article XII. PROPERTY

ADD: Section 2. Records, proceedings, and other historically significant documents shall be archived for the Branch at the Western Historical Manuscript Collection, State Historical Society of Missouri Research Center-Kansas City (UMKC). Artifacts shall be held by the Kansas City Museum, Union Station.
