Another change in the wind is the development of an event that will assist female engineering students and recent female graduates of engineering to connect with potential employers. The "Speed





AAUW-KC and the National Archives will host a presentation by a distinguished panel of local experts who will address this question from many different view points. Panelists include: Amy Conger, ADA Compliance Manager for Kansas City, Missouri; Lewis Diuguid, Kansas City Star Editor and Columnist; Judy Hellman, Jewish Community Relations Bureau; Stuart Hinds, Gay and Lesbian Archive of Mid-America (GLAMA) and Assistant Dean of Special Collections and Archives at UMKC; Bette Tate-Beaver, panel moderator and Executive Director for National Association of Multicultural Education (NAME); and Arzie Umali, Assistant Director, Women's Center UMKC.
