# JOIN US FOR A CONVERSATION ON TITLE IX: VIOLENCE PREVENTION AND RESPONSE

On the evening of Thursday, January 12, we will gather for a light reception at 6:00 p.m. followed by a Title IX program from 6:45–7:45 at the beautiful Diastole Scholar's Center at UMKC (2501 Holmes).

Our speaker is **Michelle Kroner**, UMKC Violence Prevention and Response Manager. Title IX legislation states: "No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving federal financial assistance." In addition, the Mandated Reporter Requirement of Title IX indicates that "Any employee of the University who becomes aware of sex discrimination is a Mandated Reporter, regardless of whether the recipient of the behavior is a student, employee, volunteer or visitor of the University."

Title IX is mandated and enforced on all university and high school campuses...and in April 2011, the Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights (OCR) added that "sexual violence is a form of sexual harassment." Ms. Kroner will share national statistics on campus sexual assault, such as: One in five women and one in 16 men are sexually assaulted while in college; More than 90% of sexual assault survivors on college campuses do not report the assault; plus other startling statistics.

Save the date of Thursday, January 12, to join us for an evening of fellowship with your AAUW sisters and hear an informative program on an issue that is significant to all women and on every college and high school campus! Free parking is available in back of the Diastole Center and also curbside parking.


