cancel. We are looking forward to re-connecting and joining together on this date to celebrate our accomplishments and share a delicious potluck dinner! (See more details on page 1.)



CEDAW RESEARCH COMMITTEE CREATED

In our January/February 2020 newsletter, we shared a story titled: "KCMO City Council Bans Use of Salary History in Hiring." This ordinance was passed on May 23, 2019 thanks to the untiring efforts of **Gail James**, **Alice Kitchen** and **Carol Cowles**— all of whom are our AAUW sisters!

CEDAW is the acronym for the U.N. Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women, created in 1979 and ratified by almost all member states of the United Nations. However, to

date, it has not been ratified by the United States Senate!

The women's issues outlined in the "Cities for CEDAW" goals include:

- Women in Decision Making Roles
- Pay Equity
- Gender Policies
- Protection, Safety and Prevention of Discrimination

Spearheaded by **Gail James** and **Alice Kitchen**, AAUW-KC is moving forward

to accomplish these CEDAW objectives in Kansas City. Carol Cowles, Patti Jachowicz and Sara Pedram have agreed to research and advocate to pass KCMO policies and ordinances to help achieve these goals.

The annual events: Reentry Woman of the Year awards brunch hosted by AAUW-KC Northland and presented by the InterBranch Council (IBC); and the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL), sadly, were cancelled or rescheduled for 2021, respectively.

On the brighter side, the Reentry Woman of the Year committee is pleased to announce the 2020 scholarship recipients. Under the capable leadership of **Cela Sullivan**, IBC chair from the North Kansas City Branch, the committee came together in cyberspace (isn't technology wonderful?) and voted for the following five winners:

- Erica Haygood, Respiratory Therapy, Kansas City Kansas Community College
- Joanna Marin, Business Administration, Kansas State University
- Nadia Vallecido, Marketing < Kansas City Kansas Community College
- Catherine Bailey, BA degree-English with an emphasis in Creative Writing, UMKC

All five Reentry awardees received \$750 each. Pell grant winners, Haygood, Marin and Vallecido received cash. Bailey and Cannon both received Toni Thornton scholarships, payable to their respective colleges. (They do not have Pell grants.)
